POINTS OF OPERATION—*Mel Zeddies, Parliamentarian*

With the holidays past and the beginning of the new year, your Pacific Beach Town Council (PBTC) will be setting its activity schedule. That will include setting the event calendar, developing a proposed budget and selecting committee members. Wednesday, 20 January 2010, the newly elected members of the Board of Directors underwent a brief orientation covering our Standing Rules, By-Laws and a few points from Robert's Rules of Order.

The PBTC operates by following its Standing Rules, By-Laws and Robert's Rules of Order while also being mindful of the fact that it is incorporated in the State of California, and also is a 501(c)3 organization (which means that donations to the PBTC are tax deductible). The Standing Rules and the By-Laws provide the procedures and responsibilities that are expected to be followed by both directors and members. Of special concern are the order and behavior during meetings that are conducted by the PBTC President. Who is to speak, when they speak and for how long, as well as how to make a motion, how to second the motion and rules for voting on a motion were all topics covered at the orientation. By following these rules and treating all members with respect and consideration both our board of directors meetings and our general membership meetings benefit.

When our Standing Rules and By-Laws do not cover a given situation we turn to Robert's Rules of Order for direction. It is the Parliamentarian who insures that these rules of procedure are followed. Questions are raised as a Point of Order which requires the President to stop all business being conducted until the Point of Order is resolved. Robert's Rules of Order also gives directions on how the proposed agenda is adopted for the meeting.

Those of us on the Board of Directors are looking forward to working on the many activities of the PBTC; we want to do everything we can to help make Pacific Beach an active, clean, attractive, welcoming community for our residents and visitors alike.

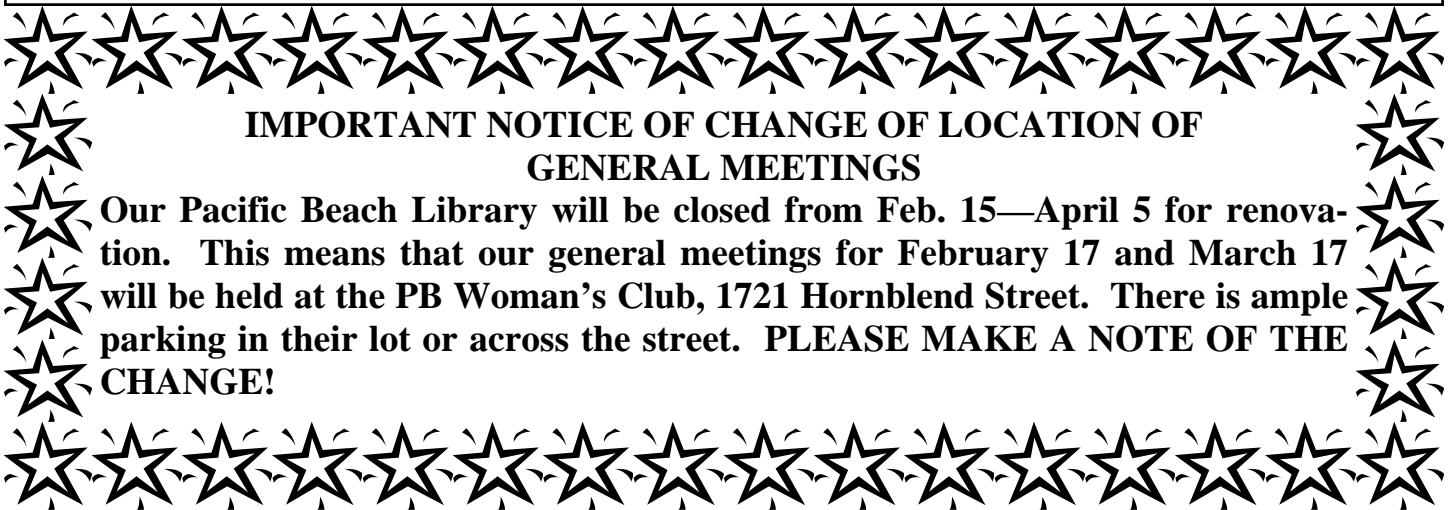

WHAT CAN YOU DO ABOUT GRAFFITI IN YOUR NEIGHBORHOOD?

First of all graffiti is against the law. It sends a message that people of that neighborhood and community don't care, and attracts more of the same negative behavior to that neighborhood.

WHOSE RESPONSIBILITY IS IT? YOURS!

WHAT CAN YOU DO ABOUT IT?

- 1) Record the location of the graffiti.
- 2) Remove it with Goof Off Graffiti remover or another solvent. You can buy these products at Home Depot. You can also paint over it with the same color.
- 3) Report it with a picture of it if possible to Officer Phil Franchina at pfranchina@pd.sandiego.gov You can also call him if you don't use email at 619-515-2749 and give him the location and what it looked like.

The PB Town Council office has an anti-graffiti kit you can check out Monday through Friday from 8:30 am—12:30 pm.
